May Updates

May has been another busy month for officers on the Clarendon Park Beat. We have been out and about dealing with the issues and offences that you have been reporting to us.

We have identified vehicle related crime and anti-social behaviour as our priorities this month as we know this is what you are concerned about. We have been working hard with our patrols and gathering intelligence to identify suspects for the offences that have taken place.

In May on the Clarendon Park NC68 beat there have been 8 offences involving vehicles, 2 cars had their property stolen, 3 were broken into and 3 were damaged. That is 8 victims of crime. We have decided to keep vehicle crime as one of our priorities into the next month of June and the beat team are conducting patrols in the target areas.

Burglaries are again down in number on the beat with only 3 reported, all three were related to commercial premises, we are working hard to keep this number low and to keep you and your property safe, you can find some crime reduction/safety information on our Leicestershire Police website.

PCSO Bannatyne has also recently been trained in the use of a 'speed monitoring gun' few pictures of its use on our Facebook page. We have been using this in response to what you tell us, and you are concerned about speeding vehicles. PCSO Bannatyne can link in with Community Speed watch where you can get involved and assist in monitoring and deterring speeding motorists where you live.



The weather has been warm and this has meant that Victoria Park has been very busy, it has been great to see many people using the park, but the amount of litter that was left afterwards was disappointing. This meant that the parks department had to work extra hard to clean up and get the park presentable for the following day. There are numerous bins around the park, use these to take your mess away. With warmer weather approaching please remember basic crime prevention advice, closing windows and making sure items are out of sight.

Please keep on reporting incident to us, we will follow them up target those causing harm to the area.
