Covid-19 Update – Localised Lockdown.

Last week the government announced a localised lockdown within Leicester and parts of Leicestershire due to the rise in Coronavirus cases. This means within the lockdown zone non-essential shops will have to close from 30th June and licensed premises will not re-open as planned on the 4th July. School will also close from the 2nd July only opening for vulnerable students and key worker students Those advised to shield are to continue to do so until this is reviewed in 2 weeks' time. Under this lockdown we will continue to use the current legislation to police both in and outside of the lockdown zone utilising the 4 Es; Engage, Explain, Encourage and lastly Enforce.

Part of the lockdown affects a large part of the beat including Glenfield and a small section of Leicester Forest East. If you are unsure if you fall within the lockdown area our colleagues at Leicestershire County Council have set up postcode checker which will tell out if you fall within lockdown area you can access the postcode checker by using the link below.

Crime Update

You may recall last month we told you about a person who was arrested by PC Jodie and S/Sgt Jamie for trying car doors in Leicester Forest East at the end of May. Since then the suspect has charged with other offences including a burglary in Glenfield they are now in prison awaiting sentencing. A great result for the beat and for Jamie's last shift as a Special Constable.

Crime Prevention

With the warmer weather upon us it is important to remember that we all remain vigilant to opportunists and take measures to reduce the chance that criminals can get into our homes. Here are a few tips to think about with regards to your home security:

- Lock doors and windows in rooms not being used and remove keys, placing them in a secure spot, it takes seconds for a criminal to walk through an open door.
- Keep anything of high value in a safe unobvious location within the house
- Install an alarm system, use timers to switch electrical items on and off to give the impression someone is home even if your only out for a couple of hours, mark your property (postcode or SMARTWATER) and Register your belongings with immobilise.com
- Do not advertise holiday plans on social media sites before/during your holiday.
- Ask a neighbour to keep an eye on your property. Can they open/close your curtains while you're away? Could they park on your driveway?
