GREATER HINCKLEY & HINCKLEY TOWN CENTRE Newsletter

October 2020

Welcome to this month's newsletter, we have continued to work closely with Public Health England, Trading Standards and our partners at Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council to try and improve concerns over social distancing in some of our pubs in Hinckley Town Centre. This has led to the closure of one premises following repeated issues not being addressed.

This month saw the visit of HRH Princess Anne to Hinckley Parks Primary School and it was a great opportunity for some of the beat team to be able to support this visit.

Throughout September we saw calls to police increase as we got closer to October with a total of 485 calls being received across our patch, this included 167 regarding public safety, 154 reporting a type of crime, 22 reports of Anti-Social Behaviour and 42 reports of an incident or offence on our road network.

You Said, We Did:

YOU SAID:

You reported issues with speeding vehicles along Leicester Road, Hinckley.

WE DID:

We have conducted speed checks in the area and identified a number of offending vehicles all of which have now been contacted by police.

YOU SAID:

You reported issues with drugs at an address near Wykin Road, Hinckley.

WE DID:

We completed a patch walk in the area and developed our intelligence in order to support us obtaining a search warrant from Leicester Magistrates Court. When we executed the warrant we found a large quantity of cannabis plants and an individual was arrested.

YOU SAID:

You reported issues with parking along Butt Lane, Hinckley particularly around school times, in addition you reports issues with groups of youths hanging around in the alley ways spitting and being abusive.

WE DID:

We have started to increase our patrols in the area and are starting to speak with drivers and educate them about the safe ways to park. We have also been working with the school to ensure that messages continue to be sent to parents that pick their children up in cars.

What is it? What's it all about? Imagine the police arrive at a report of a burglary where a car has been seen to leave. What would the police want to do? Well we would want to be able to draw a circle on a map at the scene and immediately reach out to all those in this area who have CCTV to see if they have captured the vehicle and could perhaps provide us with further information leading to arrests. We may want to alert people living in that postcode or ward so that they can be aware in case the same people come back. Or quite simply we may have identified a tactic being used by criminals and want to share some safety advice to everyone in Leicestershire to stop you being a victim. All of this and much more is possible on Neighbourhood Link.
